Westlake Women's Club will make freeway bloom

Two months ago, an editorial in this space titled "Making it happen" told how the Westlake Women's Club was going after friends and funds to landscape an interchange on the Ventura Freeway in Westlake Village.

It went after friends to get donated or partially donated materials and plans, and it went after funds to pay for what it couldn't get donated.

Two months later, there is a happy ending to the story; the donations are complete.

What a sense of accomplishment the participants must feel! Not just the 120 members of the club, who certainly deserve credit for backing the project; nor even clubwoman Dolores Simon, who made it her personal campaign to get the Lindero Canyon interchange beautified.

Others share in the achievement, too: the state highway landscaping office and its staff, the corporate and individual donors of materi-

als and money, the folks who cheered it all on and who made the phone calls and mailed the letters—all of them had a hand in it.

For \$7,500 in cash, and with a lot of gift and near-gift labor and plants, the interchange will get landscaping that would normally cost almost three times that amount. That is the ultimate "discount deal" of the year.

The sponsors of the Lindero Canyon interchange project recognize that, and they're off on a second interchange job now, this one at Westlake Boulevard.

They have a head start on funding it. The last check to the Lindero Canyon fund left a \$50 surplus and the Westlake Women's Club says that will be used to start the drive for the Westlake Boulevard work.

But that is another story, and one that will write its own happy ending. For now, one happy ending will do.

\$3,750 donated to beautify freeway

The Ventura Freeway through Westlake Village is on its way to "beauty."

Gibraltar Savings and Loan Association, owner of the Westpark Condominium Community, has announced the donation of \$3,750 to the Westlake Women's Club for its freeway beautification project.

The club is attempting to raise \$7,500 to purchase 771 plants to landscape around the Lindero Canyon Road overramps and offramps.

Dolores Simon, chairwoman of the club's beautification project, said \$1,000 had been donated by the club, and an additional \$250 was given by the Westlake Village Cultural Foundation.

The gift from Gibraltar Savings has narrowed the needed amount of funds to \$2,500.

Norman MacLeod, executive vice president of Gibraltar Savings, will present the \$3,750 check to Simon in a 2:30 p.m. ceremony on Sunday. The presentation will be held at the Westpark complex, 31563 Lindero Canyon Road. Westlake Village Mayor Bernice Bennett and Westlake Village Chamber of Commerce President John Seal will attend.
