Two months ago, an editorial in this space

state highway landscaping office and its staff,

For \$7.500 in cash, and with a lot of gift and near-gift labor and plants, the interchange will get landscaping that would normally cost almost three times that amount. That is the ultimate "discount deal" of the year. The sponsors of the Lindero Canyon interchange project recognize that, and they're off on a second interchange job now, this one at Westlake Boulevard.

They have a head start on funding it. The last check to the Lindero Canyon fund left a \$50 surplus and the Westlake Women's Club says that will be used to start the drive for the Westlake Boulevard work.

But that is another story, and one that will write its own happy ending. For now, one happy ending will do.


